PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION & ACCREDITATION

BACHELOR OF CIRCUS ARTS

The Bachelor of Circus Arts equips students with the skills, networks, and knowledge to establish a career on the world stage of circus and physical theatre through immersive and experiential practice-based studies in contemporary circus arts. It is the highest level of accredited circus training in Australia and NICA is a world leader in circus education and training.

Within NICA's world-class facilities, a supportive faculty of talented artists and practitioners teach an innovative curriculum to instil technical excellence and to enable each creative artist to flourish. Students get to develop their performance skills in a variety of settings within NICA's unique suite of performance venues, which combine large-scale, professionally equipped spaces with more intimate studios.

MAJOR STUDIES

Circus arts specialisations in three apparatus or disciplines; performance and movement studies including: ensemble performance and technical aspects of circus production; and academic subjects in: anatomy and biomechanics; history and culture of circus arts; the business of circus; the contemporary circus industry; and music and circus.

IDEAL FOR...

Skilled artists and athletes in their field looking for the platform into the industry or emerging circus artists seeking a qualification.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry into NICA is by audition, interview, and medical assessment. The audition panel completes an annual tour to Australia's major cities to look at prospective students' physical capabilities, potential and suitability for a long-term circus career.

The day long audition will involve:

- Performance and physical theatre workshop
- Movement and choreography workshop
- Physical testing and assessments including areas of strength, coordination, balance, and flexibility
- Circus skills and acrobatics workshop
- Physiotherapy screening
- Entry interview
- The audition panel will also be looking for ensemble and teamwork attributes, articulation and passion when describing their creative approach and ability to incorporate and apply knowledge and feedback to physical movement.

In addition to the audition requirement, applicants must also provide evidence of academic qualifications including satisfactory completion of one of the following:

- Successful completion of the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) or its equivalent, such as an interstate or international Year 12 qualification.
- Completion or partial completion of an approved tertiary qualification (including Certificates, Diplomas, Advanced Diplomas, Associate Degrees, and Degrees).
- Course prerequisites: VCE: Units 3 and 4 a minimum study score of 25 in any English (except EAL) or 30 in English as Alternate Language (EAL) or equivalent.

CERTIFICATE IV IN CIRCUS ARTS

Certificate IV in Circus Arts provides aspiring circus artists with an introductory experience into high performance circus arts training. It is a highly disciplined and structured program with a great deal of scope for creativity.

Core foundation training includes strength and conditioning, flexibility, acrobatics, and handstands. Students focus on their own area of specialisation and develop communication, trust and performance skills through group and partner work. A major ensemble circus performance is staged at the end of the year.

For many graduates this course is a great springboard into work in the performing arts industry, including community and contemporary circus, stunt work, theatre arts, dance, and technical production. Alternatively, graduates are equipped with the knowledge and skills to audition for the Bachelor of Circus Arts.

MAJOR STUDIES

Foundation skills in circus including group acts, individual circus specialty, performance and movement, body awareness and fitness preparation for circus performers, applied practices for circus performers and traditions and trends of circus.

The skills and knowledge encompassed in the program have been identified by industry professionals as the essential elementary introductory skills in circus, suitable for anyone wishing to undertake work in community or recreational circus, or in circus-based school

activities, such as: core circus foundation skills performer, ensemble member, or assistant in properties and bump in/out.

IDEAL FOR...

Those seeking a one-year circus experience, those who wish to acquire more specific circus skills training; and students preparing for the Bachelor of Circus Arts

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for the 10824NAT Certificate IV in Circus Arts are expected to:

- Undertake an audition to demonstrate technical and artistic skills in at least three of the following areas to NICA Circus Arts Education and Training Benchmark Introductory Elementary Level E:
 - » Fitness and conditioning
 - » Flexibility
 - » Handstands / balance
 - » Tumbling / acrobatics
 - » Strength
 - » Manipulation
 - » Demonstration of body alignment
 - » Movement and performance skills
- Have a demonstrated capacity in learning, reading, writing, oracy, and numeracy competencies to Level 3 of the Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF). (We recommend the completion of Year 12, including English Units 3 & 4 and Mathematics Units 1 & 2).

In addition to the above requirements participants must be physically able to undertake the qualification. Provision of medical evidence of suitability for circus training may be required.

THE NICA AUDITIONS

Applications to audition for the Bachelor of Circus Arts and Certificate IV in Circus Arts will close 23 August 2024.

WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT?

Auditions for entry into NICA's accredited courses are held in late September in Melbourne, Australia, and run across two days. It is recommended that you attend an audition in person. Audition via online video footage is accepted for international and geographically remote applicants.

- We want to know about your discipline/s (Circus, Gymnastics, Dance, Tricking, Parkour)
- We want to see your specialty skills
- We want to measure your physical capacity for Circus Arts
- We want to measure your strength flexibility
- We want to see you perform
- · We want to hear about your journey to date and your future ambitions
- We will assess your physical condition and discuss pre-existing injuries and injury management

PRO TIP: Attend the NICA Audition Masterclass

This masterclass prepares you for your NICA Audition to give you the best chance of acceptance.

The masterclass is ideal for prospective students to get feedback on their progress and what areas you might need to work on to increase your chances of being accepted into the Institute.

For those with previous experience, this is your opportunity to polish your application with inside knowledge, and ensure you are putting your best foot forward prior to your audition.

The NICA Audition Masterclass is a one-day intensive workshop designed to assist all applicants of various skill and experience levels in 'what' and 'how' to prepare for the NICA auditions. The program includes:

- · performance and dance classes,
- circus training (including handstands, flexibility, tumbling, strength, manipulation, and basic partner work)
- information about auditions, facilities, and student life at NICA.

Information about our pre-audition workshops and how to register will be available in Inside Track.

WHAT IT COSTS TO AUDITION

There is a one-off administration fee of \$50.00.

In addition to preparing for your audition, we suggest you also invest some time in:

- Collecting medical information.
- Thinking about your performance and writing a brief description for the audition panel.
- Preparing your body and mind based on the video audition guides and the NICA video application guide.

FAQs

Does NICA offer bridging courses for dancers or athletes who would like to transition to a career in circus?

For dancers, gymnasts, performers, or athletes who want to explore circus and prepare to study full-time at NICA we offer advanced short courses and private tuition. Visit nica.com.au for more information.

What does a typical day at NICA involve?

A full time NICA student will usually start their training day with a serious warm up. This will be followed by a good burst of tumbling, handstands and flexibility, before a solid session of group acts and partner work, manipulation and aerial. Later in the day, students will work for an hour on each of their specialties and will even find time for a performance or circus history and culture class. The day will typically end with some stretching, and/or strength and conditioning. Feeling tired?

How do I choose my specialty skill area?

Bachelor degree students choose two specialties. Certificate IV students select one specialty.

Opportunities to research and try a range of circus specialties under the guidance of experienced trainers are provided for all year levels. Students choose specialties based on their physical capacity, level of skill and the availability of staff and equipment.



Does NICA offer accommodation assistance for interstate or international students?

NICA students can access the services and assistance available to Swinburne University students, including assistance with housing. Swinburne provide on-campus (Hawthorn) accommodation and can also assist with other housing options. See the Swinburne website for more info.
